With a stack of classic hits such as 'Pure', 'The Life of Riley', 'You Showed me', 'Lucky You', 'Sugar Coated Iceberg' and 'Perfect', the Lightning Seeds were one of the most prominent bands of the 1990s. Earlier this summer lead singer Ian Broudie teamed up with Robbie Williams, Russell Brand. Frank Skinner and David Baddiel to release a re-vamped version of their football anthem 'Three Lions', to coincide with the World Cup Finals in South Africa. The anthem shot straight back into UK singles chart. 'The Very Best of The Lightning Seeds' album was released in 2006 and they are recognised as having produced some of the catchiest, happiest and most celebratory pop songs of all time.


## Gino D'Acampo

### Aazam Ahmad








Rochdale's very own Andrew
